1.4 Intended Use

- The surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx measuring system is designed for use in industrial applications.
 - Non-contact optical measurement of diffuse reflective surfaces
 - Quality monitoring as well as form/position and surface inspection
- The system must only be operated within the limits specified in the technical data, see Chap. 3.2.
- The sensor must be used in such a way that no persons are endangered or machines and other material goods are damaged in the event of malfunction or total failure of the sensor.
- Take additional precautions for safety and damage prevention in case of safety-related applications.

1.5 Proper Environment

- Protection class
 - Sensor: IP67 (only applies in the case of connected output connectors and/or installed protective caps)

Optical paths during operation are excluded from the protection class.

Contamination of the paths causes impairment or failure of the function.

The IP67 protection class is a specification that is limited to protection from dust and water. Oil, steam and emulsion effects are not included in this protection class and must be evaluated separately.

- Temperature range

■ Operation: 0 ... +45 °C ¹ (+32 ... +113 °F) (with appropriate heat dissipation)

■ Storage: -20 ... +70 °C (-4 ... +158 °F)

- Humidity: 20 ... 80 % RH (non condensing)

2. Light Source

The surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx sensor works with an LED lighting unit. Measurement is performed using blue light at the dominant 459 nm wavelength. The sensor is included in risk group 2 according to EN 62471: 2008.


3. Functional Principle, Technical Data

3.1 Short Description

3.1.1 Measuring Principle

surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx is a sensor for non-contact and non-destructive optical and three-dimensional detection of components with diffuse reflective surfaces. It operates according to the optical triangulation principle (fringe projection):

- Using a matrix projector, a sequence of patterns is projected onto the surface of the test object.
- The light of the patterns diffusely reflected by the test object surface is recorded by two cameras.
- The three-dimensional surface of the test object is then calculated from the recorded image sequence and the arrangement of the two cameras to each other.

3.1.2 System Setup

The surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx measuring system is a compact sensor with an integrated controller. All necessary integral parts are combined in one housing.

3.1.3 Special Performance Features

- surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx is characterized by a compact design and highly accurate measurements while at the same time achieving high throughput of 3D points.
- Data are output via Gigabit Ethernet. GigE Vision compatibility allows the sensor to be integrated in different ways:
 - Software provided by Micro-Epsilon
 - Software by third parties
 - SDK
- Gigabit Ethernet as a fast default connection to the PC
- The sensor additionally offers an I/O interface:
 - Querying sensor states
 - External control, e.g., triggering

4. Delivery

4.1 Unpacking, Included in Delivery

- 1 Sensor surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx
- 1 Assembly instructions
- 1 Calibration final inspection
- 3 Protective caps
- 1 ECR3000-5 supply cable 5 m
- 1 SCR3000X-5 Ethernet interface cable 5 m
- Carefully remove the components of the measuring system from the packaging and ensure that the goods are forwarded in such a way that no damage can occur.
- Check the delivery for completeness and shipping damage immediately after unpacking.
- If there is damage or parts are missing, immediately contact the manufacturer or supplier.

4.2 Storage

5. Installation and Mounting

5.1 Attachment and Mounting

- using 2 or 3 screws M5, screwed directly
- using 2 or 3 screws M4, screwed pushed through

Depending on the installation position, it is recommended to define the sensor position using centering elements and fitting bores.

The cylindrical counterbore Ø8H7 is intended for the position-defining centering elements. This allows for the sensor to be mounted in a reproducible and exchangeable way.

The mounting dimensions refer to the dimensional drawings.

NOTICE

Pay attention to careful handling during mounting and operation. Damage to or destruction of the sensor.

Mount the sensor by means of screws type M5 or by means of through bores for M4.

The bearing surfaces surrounding the fastening holes (through-holes) are slightly raised. Mount the sensor only to the existing holes on a flat surface. Clamps of any kind are not permitted. Do not exceed torques.

Damage to or destruction of the sensor; inaccurate, erroneous measuring values.




Fig. 5 Mounting example with bolt connection




Fig. 7 Dimensional drawing mounting bores, sensor surfaceCONTROL 3D 32xx-80 und surfaceCONTROL 3D 32xx-120, dimensions in mm, not to scale




Fig. 8 Dimensional drawing mounting bores, sensor surfaceCONTROL 3D 32xx-240, dimensions in mm




Fig. 9 Dimensional drawing sensor surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx-30, dimensions in mm (inches, rounded off)




Fig. 10 Dimensional drawing sensor surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx-80, dimensions in mm (inches, rounded off)




Fig. 11 Dimensional drawing sensor surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx-120, dimensions in mm (inches, rounded off)




Fig. 12 Dimensional drawing sensor surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx-240, dimensions in mm (inches, rounded off)

5.2.2 Supply Voltage (Power)

The power supply connection in the form of a 4-pin M12 round connector has a current carrying capacity of up to 2 A per pin.

Use only shielded lines or original cables from the accessories program for the power supply connection or the outputs. Micro-Epsilon recommends the ECR3000-*x* shielded supply cable.

5.2.3 Gigabit Ethernet Connection

The Ethernet connection is the standard connection to the PC. The sensor supports transmission at 1 Gbit/s. An 8-pin X-coded M12 socket is installed in the housing.

For use with an Ethernet connection, we recommend the SCR3000X-x Gigabit Ethernet connection cable; cable length x in meters. Characteristics: $4 \times 2 \times 0.14$ mm²; shielded.

Due to the high data rate, we recommend a high-quality Ethernet PC plug-in card, for example, Intel-Pro/1000 PT. Preferably the sensors should be connected directly to the network connection or using a high-quality switch. A hub would cause massive data collisions and may not be used. On the PC, one or more network cards should always be intended solely for the sensors.

Operating the sensors via Ethernet requires no additional driver installation. However, the network settings must be specified correctly:

- The sensor supports DHCP. This setting is enabled by default and has priority over searching in the link local network.
- A fixed IP address can be assigned.
- Various network settings (e.g. firewall or packet filters) can interfere with communications with the sensor.
- The sensor supports jumbo frames up to 9014 bytes/packet; however, in that case all network components must also support jumbo frames up to that size.

5.2.4 Multi-Function Connection I/O

Interfaces and signals for external control of the sensor or for outputting sensor states and data are provided via the multi-function connection. The four connections operate either as inputs or outputs.

The multi-function connection is a 12-pin M12 round connector. The connecting line is intended to be up to 35 m long; however, the cable must be shielded at any length. Micro-Epsilon recommends using the PCR3000-*x* multi-function cable.

5.2.4.1 Digital Signals

The four digital connections of the multi-function interface provided can operate optionally as inputs or outputs. They are configured using the software. All digital ports share a joint ground GND GPIO.

External auxiliary power (max. 30 V) is required to use the outputs.

The digital signals are not suitable for brief signal pulses or time-critical signals. The exception is port 1, which, when configured correctly, can be used as a hardware trigger to start a measurement and is directly connected to the sequence control in the sensor.




Fig. 17 Programmable inputs and outputs

The functionality of the digital signals can be programmed, see Fig. 17. In addition to direction, polarity can also be switched for the inputs and outputs. Internal sensor signals can be assigned to the digital outputs, for example, to control additional connected devices.



Fig. 18 Internal signal for digital outputs


5.2.4.2 Electrical Parameters of Digital Inputs, Multi-Function Connection

The switching levels of the digital inputs are defined based on HTL logic: Low 0 ... 3 V, High 11 ... 24 V (up to 30 V permitted). Maximum input current is internally limited to 5 mA.

The GPIO_1 input can also be used as a trigger signal. The minimum pulse duration when used as a trigger signal is 50 μ s. Switching delay until a measurement is triggered is at most 10 μ s.



All inputs can be used as logical inputs, but not for time-critical tasks.



5.2.4.3 Electrical Parameters of Digital Outputs, Multi-Function Connection

The digital outputs require an external auxiliary voltage between 5 V and 30 V as well as load resistance. They can be operated at a load current of at most 100 mA. This may occur, for example, by using an NPN-switching input module of a control.

The outputs are switched using a SolidState relay and are low active.




Fig. 19 Example for the timing behavior of an output at VCC GPIO = 24 V, I $_{

m I}$ = 2.4 k Ω




Fig. 20 Switching times of digital output

5.3 Installation Instructions

For all connection cables, use only the appropriate cables from the optional accessories.

NOTICE Tighten the cable connectors. The recommended tightening/screwing torque is at most 1.0 Nm.

Do not apply force when tightening.

> Damage to or destruction of the sensor

Lay all connection cables in accordance with the generally applicable measuring technology regulations, i.e. for example not directly next to pulse-carrying lines, preferably in a separate cable duct.

Never bend the cables more tightly than the minimum bending radii.

MICRO-EPSILON recommends using the optionally available power supply PS2020, installation of top-hat rail, input 230 VAC, output 24 VDC/2.5 A, see Chap. A 2.

5.4 Commissioning

The sensor may only be connected to peripherals when it does not carry power, that is, only when the supply voltage has been switched off.

- Mount the sensor according to the installation instructions, see Chap. 5.1.
- Connect the sensor to the Ethernet cable.
- Connect the Ethernet cable to the PC.
- Connect the sensor to the power supply.

6. Operation

6.1 Turning On

Turn on the external DC voltage supply (24 VDC).

The Power LED is constantly illuminated green if sufficient supply voltage is applied.

The State LED flashes orange and green during hardware connection and initialization.

After completion, it is constantly illuminated green. For more information, see the "LED Displays" section, see Chap. 3.3.

The surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx sensor requires a warm-up time of typically 60 minutes for precise measurements.

6.2 Operating Programs

Various programs are provided for operation of the sensor.

- 3D View visualizes in space three-dimensional point data that have been detected with surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx.
- 3DInspect solves industrial 3D measurement tasks.
- You can use surfaceCONTROL DefMap3D 7.0 for the individual analysis of surfaces with surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx.

6.3 Installation

6.3.1 Requirements

The following minimum system requirements are necessary for the operation of the operating programs:

- Windows 8 or 8.1, Windows 10 (each 64 Bit)
- 1-GHz or higher prozessor (64 Bit)
- 4 GB RAM
- Screen resolution: 1280 x 1024
- Graphic card / GPU with OpenGL 3.1 or higher
- Connect the sensor directly to the PC. Do not use hubs.

To be able to use the software the following steps must be followed:

- 1. Install the Ethernet interface hardware, if not already installed.
- 2. Install the software.
- 3. With DefMap3D, connect and license the USB dongle required for this.
- 4. Connect the surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx measuring system via Ethernet to the PC.
- If your network card supports the VLAN option, this option must be disabled.

6.3.2 Connecting surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx to the PC

To connect surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx via Ethernet to the PC, proceed as follows:

- Complete the installation of the software.
- 2. Connect surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx to the PC using the Ethernet interface.
- 3. Turn on the power supply.
- 4. Wait until the surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx measuring system is recognized by the PC. This takes about 1 minute.
- To be able to operate the sensor, the PC and the sensor must be located in the same subnet. $oldsymbol{1}$

You can now operate the surfaceCONTROL 3D 35xx measuring system using the operating programs listed above.

6.4 Notes for Operation

6.4.1 Measuring Range

The measuring range of the sensors is factory-set.

The area illuminated by the projector is relevant for the actual measuring range of the sensor. The cameras are arranged in such a way that both cameras capture the area illuminated by the projector within the complete measuring volume.

The extension of the measuring range in Z direction varies due to the point-shaped light source of the projector and the fan-out over the lens, see Fig. 10, see Fig. 11.

6.4.2 Calibration

The calibration of the sensor serves to determine the orientation of the camera coordinates in the coordinate system of the inspection system and is carried out with the aid of a pre-calibrated calibration target.

The sensor is factory calibrated upon delivery. An acceptance report is included with each sensor.

6.4.3 Positioning of Sensor and Test Object


6.4.3.1 General

- Note the following instructions for optimum positioning of the sensor and test object.
- Observe an optimum distance between the sensor and the surface of the test object, see Chap. 3.2.
- Align the sensor with predominantly diffusely reflecting surfaces almost perpendicular to the surface. To avoid direct reflection, we recommend that you tilt the sensor by a few degrees.
- In the case of partially glossy surfaces, reflections from the test object can be reduced by inclining the sensor by up to 30° with respect to the surface of the test object.

6.4.3.2 Alignment with Crosshair

You will achieve the best results in the mid of the measuring range (focal range of cameras).

Use the positioning pattern to easily and optimally align the sensor in the mid of the measuring range. Align the pattern of the projection with the superimposed pattern.






Fig. 22 Result of camera images when aligned with crosshair




Fig. 23 Distance too short (6 mm above the zero plane)




Fig. 24 Distance too large (4 mm under the zero plane)




Fig. 25 Lateral tilt (plane angle x: 7° tilted around the y-axis), distance correct




Fig. 26 Lateral tilt (plane angle y: 16° tilted around the x-axis), distance correct

6.4.4 Exposure

The projected fringe pattern should be well recognizable over the entire measurement plane (not too light/dark) in order to avoid overdriven and underdriven pixels.




Fig. 27 Result of camera images with good exposure




Fig. 28 Camera image, measuring object overexposed




Fig. 29 Camera image, measuring object underexposed

6.5 Temperature

The sensor issues a warning when the internal temperature exceeds 60 $^{\circ}$ C (+140 $^{\circ}$ F).

The sensor refuses measurements when the internal temperature exceeds 63 °C (+145,5 °F).

The sensors turns off when the internal temperature exceeds 65 °C (+149 °F).

6.6 Error Influences

6.6.1 Reflection Factor of the Surface of the Target

The sensor evaluates the diffuse portion of the reflected light. Any statement about a minimum reflection factor is only possible with reservations. A preliminary examination is necessary to use the sensor on reflective, highly reflective or transparent objects.

6.6.2 Color Differences

Color differences between test objects result in apparent changes of the surface texture of the test object and thus also influence the calculation of the 3D data from the acquired images. Therefore color differences can result in increased measurement inaccuracies and reduced detection performance.

As the exposure parameters can only be changed as a whole, careful matching of the exposure to the target surface is recommended.

6.6.3 Temperature Influences

When the sensor is commissioned, a warm-up time of at least 60 minutes is required to achieve uniform temperature distribution in the sensor. Large temperature fluctuations and changes of the ambient climate act directly on the sensor and its fixing elements and can thus change the detection performance.

6.6.4 External Light

For external light suppression, the sensor is equipped with corresponding filters in front of the camera lenses. They allow only a narrow (band-limited) wavelength range around the wavelength of the light projected onto the test object. In general, additional shielding of external light directly emitted on the target or reflected in the sensor is recommended for highly accurate measurements.

- $\dot{1}$ Pay particular attention to unwanted reflections of the projected structured light outside the target area (background, object holder or similar) which can be reflected back again into the view area of the sensor.
- $\dot{1}$ Matt black surface coatings are recommended for all objects outside the measuring range (object holders, transport equipment, grippers or similar).

6.6.5 Mechanical Vibrations

As high resolutions in the μ m range will be achieved with the inspection system, particular attention must be paid to as vibration-free a set-up of sensor and test object as possible.

6.6.6 Surface Roughness and Texture

Surface roughnesses of the order of 5 μ m and more, as well as textures on the surface, result in increased "surface noise". In addition, direct reflections of the projected light can also occur on grinding marks or small scratches on the surface. This can result in inaccurate measured values. Remedy can possibly be provided by adjusting the exposure or by changing other sensor settings.

6.6.7 Shadowing Effects and Multiple Reflections

Shadowing effects and multiple reflections occur particularly frequently on strongly curved surfaces. Steep edges and large differences in height lead to certain areas on the test object being underprojected. Furthermore, parts of the test object cannot be detected completely by the cameras, which leads to a loss of measuring points on the surface. This effect can be diminished by a change in orientation of the sensor to the surface.

Multiple reflections of the projected pattern from certain areas of the surface to other areas of the surface lead to overlaps of the original pattern. This can result in inaccurate measured values.




Fig. 30 Shadowing of the receiver

6.7 Cleaning

A periodically cleaning of the protective housings is recommended.

Dry cleaning

This requires a suitable optical antistatic brush or blow off the panels with dehumidified, clean and oil free compressed air. Use a dry, clean, soft, lint-free, antistatic lens cloth to clean the protective glass.

Wet cleaning

Use a clean, soft, lint-free cloth or lens cleaning paper and pure alcohol (isopropanol) for cleaning the protective housing. Do not use commercial glass cleaner or other cleaning agents.

A 3 Genicam surfaceCONTROL Parameters

Parameter Description

Observe the notes below if you operate the sensor with a third party library for Genicam/GigE Vision:

- The library must support GigE Vision 2.1. In particular, MultiPart mode must be supported.
- Three sources are available to set the parameters of the sensor, see the SourceSelector description below. However, data are always transmitted using StreamChannel 0. Before starting data transmission with the Acquisition—Start command, the entry Source0 must be selected as SourceSelector.
- The network card used should be configured as follows:
 - Jumbo frames: enable/use largest possible value
 - Interrupt throttling: enable
 - Interrupt throttling rate: adaptive
 - Receive buffer: use largest possible value
- The Coord3D_C32f pixel format is used for 3D measurements. If this pixel format is not supported by the library used, the Mono16 pixel format can be used as an alternative. In that case, however, the resolution or measuring range is limited.
- The operating mode and sensor data transmitted are controlled using the parameter ComponentEnable and the associated selectors SourceSelector, RegionSelector and ComponentSelector, as well as via TriggerMode and TriggerSoftware. The following modes are possible, among others:
